- April is Autism Awareness month. Please see the attached flier.
- We will be doing Bus Evacuations over the next week with all bus riders. This is a typical safety drill that is completed in the fall and spiring each year. The drills will be completed in the morning as the buses arrive.

- For marking period 3:
 - Cohort B students will receive their report cards and carry them home on Thursday, April 15.
 - Cohort A students will receive their report cards and carry them home on Monday, April 19.
 - Report cards will be mailed to 100% virtual students no later than Monday, April 19.

An Update Regarding State Testing

- The United States Department of Education recently gave states the flexibility to extend the state assessment window into next school year. CCPS will administer MCAP ELA and math in Grades 3-8, plus ELA 10 and Algebra 1, in the fall of 2021. The testing window will most likely open in mid-September, and the test will be shorter than the one that would have been given in the spring of 2021. DLM alternate assessments will also be given in the fall. Students in ELA 10 and Algebra 1 must take but not pass the assessment as a graduation requirement.
- Students who were scheduled to take the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment in grades 5, 8, and high school this spring will, as of now, take the MISA in the fall of 2021. MSDE has, however, submitted a waiver request to the United States Department of Education regarding the administration of the MISA.
- If approved, then students who were required to take the MISA in the spring of 2021 will not have to take the assessment in fall of 2021. If the waiver is not granted, high school students will have to take but not pass the assessment as a graduation requirement.
